FY 2023 SLRC Annual Report

The SLRC Annual Plan for FY 2023 responds to the FY 2023 to FY 2021 State Library Resource Center Strategic Plan. SLRCs Core Values and Guiding Principles are Collaboration, Communication, Customers First, and Responsibility.

Organizational Effectiveness

Goal 1: SLRC is an adaptive organization that fosters proactive and responsive relationships with the library community.

Action steps:

1.1 - Members of the SLRC Management Team, Pratt Executive Team, and other Pratt library staff will actively participate in MSLA-sponsored community of practice groups.(C)

1.2 The Delivery Study will allow for better planning and understanding of distribution structures and will help define capacity expectations in academic, school, and special libraries. Recommendations for efficiency and stakeholder needs based improvements will be considered by the state network group. The study will kick off, and provide mechanisms to continue ongoing conversation between delivery partners and MSLA. (I)

- John Huber & Associates, Inc completed work on the Delivery Study on August 5, 2022.
- John Huber & Associates, Inc presented their recommendations to members of the Maryland State Library Network on August 29, 2022 at the State Library Resource

Center.

- MILO Staff and EPFL Drivers conducted a test run of the study's proposed LINCS Delivery route changes on 11/05.
- SLRC Operations Manager and SLRC Chief met with Hub City Express, Inc. to discuss delivery study findings, proposed route changes, and request for new service quotes on 11/10/2022.
- Hub City Express, Inc. (Contractual delivery courier for WMRLA, FCPL, MCPL, PGCMLS, and SLRC) completed test runs of proposed delivery routes changes including a connection to Fairview (SMRLA) in November and December. Hub City has provided SLRC with feedback and updated quotes on December 28th, 2022. SLRC is reviewing this information and plans to make recommendations to EPFL Leadership, MSL and the Regional Libraries in time for budget requests and planning.
- Hub City Express, Inc. provided several quotes to support Statewide Delivery. SLRC provided a written update and recommendations for the MSLN Meeting on 2/28, a follow-up meeting was scheduled to discuss these recommendations further on 3/9.
- SLRC is moving forward with an expanded courier services contract with Hub City Express, Inc. starting FY2024.
- SLRC Operations Manager and MILO Manager met virtually on 4/20 with the CEO and the Head of Information & Access Services for Southern Maryland Regional Library Association to discuss the next steps for the launch of direct MILO delivery to Southern Maryland. SMRLA is installing a shed as a delivery drop/exchange location at Fairview. Once installation is complete, SMRLA will notify SLRC to begin delivery test runs.
- On 6/27 SLRC Operations Manager, MILO Manager, and Delivery Courier conducted a site visit to the Fairview Branch of the Calvert County Public Library to view and receive keys to the MILO Delivery drop location, which is an external shed located in the branch parking lot. Present at the site visit was SMRLA's Head of Information & Access Services, ILL Coordinator and Fairview's Branch Manager. The SLRC team also participated in a tour of the Fairview Branch.

1.3 SLRC Deputy Chiefs will present their own updates at SLRC Oversight meetings, will participate in statewide groups, and will work on statewide projects. This will allow SLRC staff to build their own statewide networks in order to respond more quickly and effectively to customers needs.(C)

- The Marina User Group meets virtually on the 3rd Thursday of each month (excluding December.)
- SLRC Operations Manager met with the Maryland Interlibrary Loan (MAILL) Board Chair and MLA President to discuss ways SLRC and MLA can support MAILL.
- The Passport Users Group (PUG), Marina Users Group, the MLA Support Staff Division have been invited to meet and present in person at the Maryland Statewide Circulation Conference on September 29, 2022.
- SLRC and EPFL hosted a reception and tour for attendees of YALSA's Young Adult Services Symposium on November 5, 2022. 120 Teen Librarians from around the country participated.
- SLRC hosted the MAILL Forum onsite in the Poe Room as a hybrid event and provided a SLRC tour to MAILL members on 11/9/2022.

- Relais' lead program developer resigned a few months ago, and OCLC has been actively recruiting a replacement. As of 3/9 they have hired two new programmers. Daily operations and support requests have not experienced any major impacts. However, we were informed that any future complex programming and development needs would experience delays. We asked OCLC to provide a formal update regarding this matter.
- On 2/28, the SLRC Operations Manager and MILO Manager met with the Director and Assistant Director of the Maryland State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled to explore options to increase the access to large print fiction resources for LBPD patrons.
- OCLC will be migrating the data center from the Relais office in Ottawa to the OCLC offices in Toronto in mid August 2023. This will be on a weekend and the system should be up and running by the following Monday.
- SLRC Operations Manager received a request to join the 2024 MLA DLA/Conference Planning Committee, and serve as co-coordinator of Ignite Talks.

1.3 The Chief of SLRC will work closely with the Enoch Pratt Free Library's Chief of Neighborhood Library Services, Programing & Outreach, CEO, and others to ensure that pilot programs and other initiatives, both originating from SLRC and from the city are presented to our statewide stakeholders via webinar, conference, or training to ensure all libraries in Maryland can benefit from our experiences. (C)

Team of SLRC staff are spearheading outreach to library staff from Academic Libraries in MD, including Morgan State and Loyola. Team has met library staff at Morgan, and presented "Intro to SLRC Services" tailored for Academic Libraries. Team is now working on hosting representatives from these institutions at SLRC, and providing an in-person tour and collection overview.
